Right to Life of Michigan endorses Robertson *Exclusive endorsement key to GOP primary*

The Right to Life of Michigan Political Action Committee announced today its endorsement of David B. Robertson (R-Grand Blanc Township) in the 26th District Republican Primary.

"I'm committed to the sanctity of life and glad to receive the endorsement of Right to Life of Michigan Political Action Committee," Robertson said. "Returning to Lansing as state senator to fight on behalf of the unborn is a major goal for me."

During his service in the Michigan House of Representatives, Robertson developed Public Act 77 of 2006, which requires abortion providers to tell expectant mothers that they have a right to see the moving ultrasound image or photograph of their unborn children before they make the fateful decision to abort. Robertson was also the chief House sponsor of the Legal Birth Definition Act, Michigan's ban on Partial Birth Abortion. This legislation was later affirmed by the people of Michigan through initiated legislation, before being overturned by the U.S. Court of Appeals.

In making their endorsement RLM-PAC stated, "The years ahead will bring us new opportunities to defend the civil rights of the unborn, handicapped and elderly frail. Your support and leadership will be absolutely essential in restoring the basic right to life to the most helpless members of our human family. The RLM-PAC is honored to support you in this primary election."

"I'm especially proud to be the *only* candidate in the Republican Primary to receive this endorsement," Robertson added. "This is significant. In her final term in office, former Rep. Fran Amos (R-Waterford Twp.) voted repeatedly with pro-abortion legislators to weaken Michigan's Partial Birth Abortion ban. These pro-abortion votes did not go unnoticed by Right to Life of Michigan and will not go unnoticed by the voters of the 26th District."

The 26th Senate district includes the Genesee County communities of Grand Blanc, Grand Blanc Township, Atlas Township, Village of Goodrich, Davison, Davison Twp., Burton, Richfield Twp., Forest Twp., Otisville, Thetford Twp., Clio, Vienna Twp., Mt. Morris and Mt. Morris Twp. It also includes the Oakland County communities of Ortonville, Brandon, Groveland, Springfield, and Waterford Townships.

State Sen. Deborah Cherry (D-Burton) is term-limited and cannot seek re-election.
